Invitation to Participate in Milwaukee Consultation on National Action Plan on Women, Peace, and Security

The Women's International League for Peace & Freedom-Milwaukee (WILPF), in partnership with Mt Mary College Peace Studies, invites you to participate in a historic event to be held in Milwaukee. We will host a consultation on U.N. Resolution 1325 to contribute to its implementation in the U.S. and raise awareness in Wisconsin. We will host one of a few national consultations in a few weeks. It offers a wonderful opportunity to network with other like-minded people, to deepen our commitments, and to contribute to a more secure nation.

WHAT IS UN RES. 1325? United Nations Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace, and Security, and its sister resolutions, mandates consultations with women's organizations and other civil society organizations in both the creation and implementation of its Member States' 1325 National Action Plans (NAPs). (To read the resolution, go to http://www.un.org/events/res_1325e.pdf.) WILPF has strongly lobbied to demand civil society input and to ensure that the U.S. 1325 NAP doesn't become just a tool to make war safe for women, BUT serves to advance the status of women and prevent future wars. We encourage consultation participants to read WILPF's position paper at www.wand.org

WHAT TO EXPECT: The purpose of the gathering in Milwaukee is to bring women (and allies) to the table to collectively voice their concerns and have an impact on the implementation of Res. 1325. The State Department representative will brief us on the progress of the NAP, with the opportunity for Q&A, and a US WILPF representative will discuss WILPF's perspective on women, peace, and security. Participants will conduct discussions in break-out sessions on various topics and then report back to the group as a whole. We will discuss the implications of war and militarization on women here at home

HOW YOU CAN BE INVOLVED: We ask your organization to send two to three women to participate in the consultations. Individuals (women and men) not representing an organization are also encouraged to attend. We want to connect with women and allies who are open minded, knowledgeable, and passionate about these key social justice issues.
